- Colours & Types: Huge range. 2 body types: <u>Ultra</u> (flat faced) and <u>Traditional</u>. CFA has 7 color divisions for competition: Solid Color, Silver and Golden, Shaded and Smoke, Tabby, Particolor (<u>tortoiseshell</u>, blue-cream, chocolate tortoiseshell and lilac-cream), Bicolor (<u>calicos</u>, bi-colors, smoke & whites, <u>tabby & whites</u>), <u>Himalayan</u> (pointed)
